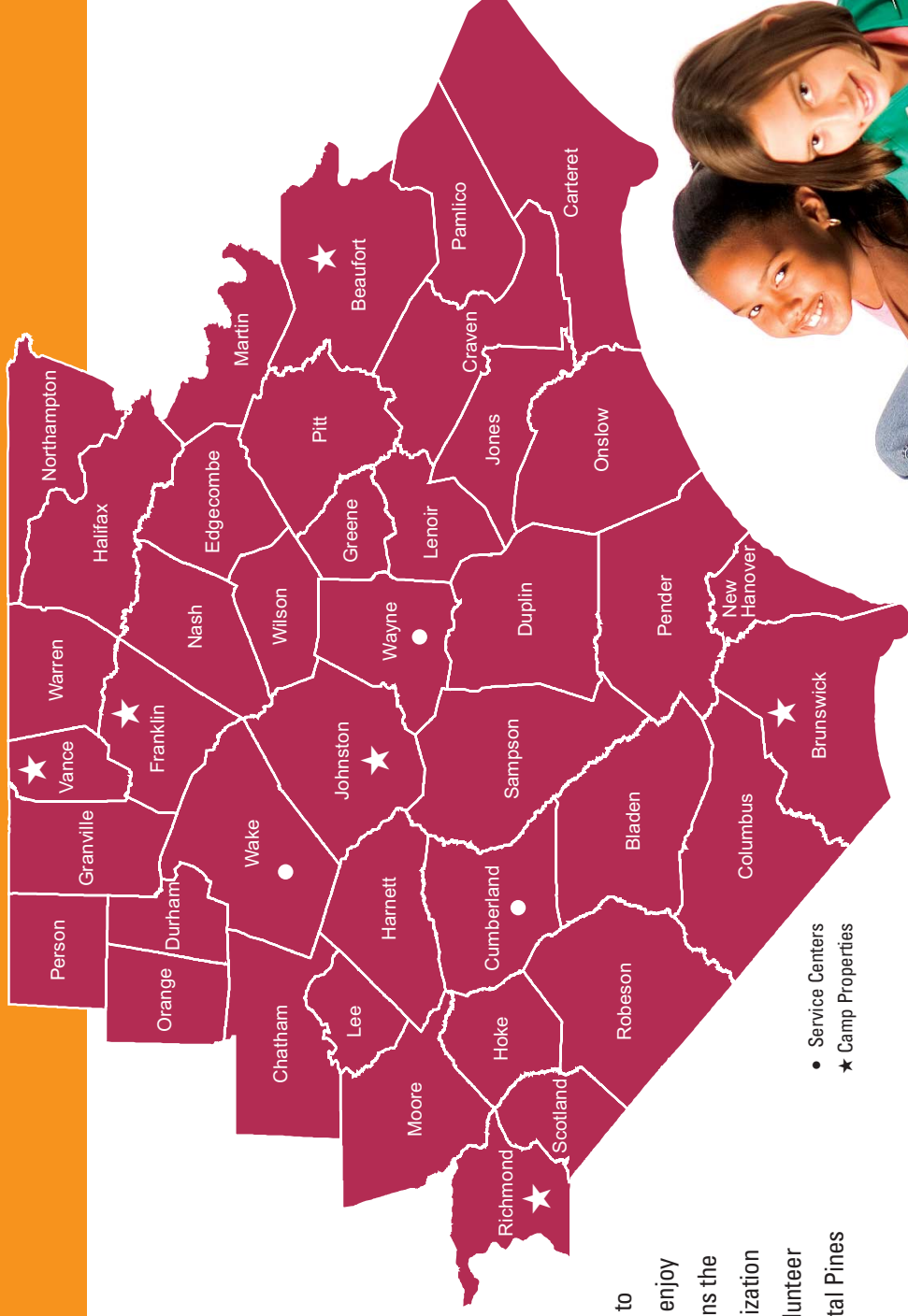
Our Council

This year has been an historic one for the Girl Scout Council of Coastal Carolina and Pines of Carolina Girl Scout Council. On October 1, 2007, the councils joined together to form Girl Scouts – North Carolina Coastal Pines.

This new structure allows the combined council to welcome more girls and enables current and new volunteers to enjoy a more impactful and flexible experience. The merger strengthens the Girl Scout infrastructure and resources at all levels of the organization including fundraising, public relations, property, staffing, and volunteer support. Building on our past, Girl Scouts – North Carolina Coastal Pines moves into the future, providing all girls and volunteers with the pre-eminent leadership and personal development program.

One of more than 200 Girl Scout councils chartered by Girl Scouts of the USA, Girl Scouts – North Carolina Coastal Pines boasts 41,426 girl and adult members in 41 central and eastern North Carolina counties. With corporate headquarters in Raleigh, two regional service centers, and six camp properties in the region plus partner organizations – colleges and universities; art, science and history museums; and many historic sites – Girl Scouts – North Carolina Coastal Pines has the best and brightest resources to deliver high-quality program opportunities to our girls.

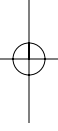
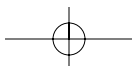
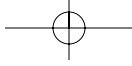

Our Mission

Girl Scouting builds girls of courage, confidence, and character who make the world a better place.





Our Girls

Girl Scouts – North Carolina Coastal Pines served 31,431 girls in our 41 central and eastern North Carolina counties in 2006-2007. Reflecting the diverse society in which we live, 50 percent of our girl members identified themselves as racially or ethnically diverse.

While many girls enjoyed membership in 1,666 troops, Girl Scouts – North Carolina Coastal Pines offered the Girl Scout experience to 12,392 girls in 424 outreach sites. In cooperation with after-school programs, day care centers, houses of worship, parks and recreation centers, alternative schools, summer migrant programs, correctional facilities, and community centers as well as through partnerships with other youth-serving agencies, Girl Scouts – North Carolina Coastal Pines provided character-building activities focusing on leadership development; health and fitness; and science, technology, engineering and mathematics.

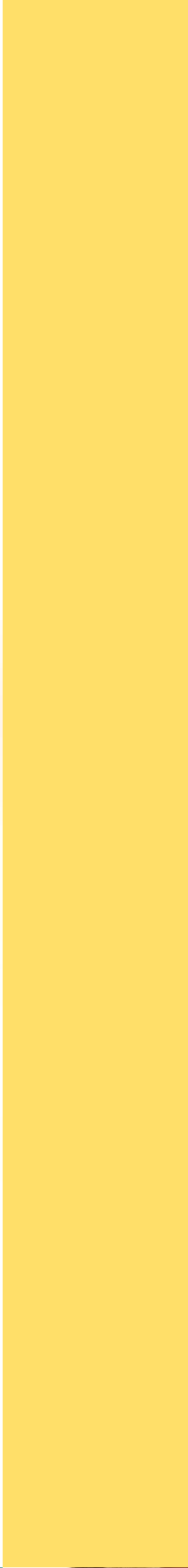


Our Program

In Girl Scouting, girls develop leadership skills while learning the importance of personal responsibility, the value of goal setting, the spirit of teamwork, and the thrill of accomplishment. Last year, 18,419 girls participated in 278 council-sponsored events and girl trainings. From sports skill-building clinics to career mentoring, world travel and cultural exchanges to local community service projects, environmental stewardship to financial literacy, Girl Scouts – North Carolina Coastal Pines offers endless opportunities for girls to grow in courage, confidence, and character while making the world a better place.

> With the goal of keeping families together and connected, Girl Scouts – North Carolina Coastal Pines worked with the North Carolina Correctional Institution for Women to offer girls and their incarcerated mothers the opportunity to spend quality time together in a supportive environment. The girls from across North Carolina traveled to the prison once a month where, together with their mothers, they participated in character-building activities.

> In 2006-2007, the council partnered with public school systems in Chatham, Duplin, Harnett, Johnston, Lee, Nash, Pender, and Pitt counties to enrich summer school outreach to Hispanic and migrant children. Girl Scout program activities in the areas of health and fitness, science, and cultural awareness helped to incorporate fun into the academic day and gave girls added confidence to achieve academically and feel great about themselves.



Becoming Leaders

The leaders of tomorrow are Girl Scouts today. Girl Scouts – North Carolina Coastal Pines offered girls the opportunity to build leadership skills and put the newly acquired traits to practice.

> Girl Scouts – North Carolina Coastal Pines provided teen girls with leadership training so they may work with younger girl troops and at local and council events. In addition, teens with a love of the great outdoors developed leadership skills while spending a portion of their summer serving as counselors-in-training at resident camp or program aides at local day camps.

> More than 150 teen girls participated in the council's first leadership summit funded by a grant from the Josephus Daniels Charitable Fund of the Triangle Community Foundation. With the support and guidance of women leaders in business and on college campuses, girls explored communication, group dynamics, integrity and values in action, personal leadership styles, and the importance of balance in communication.

> A group of teen Girl Scouts helped to lead Girl Scouting in the right direction by serving on the it² (Inspire Today, Inspire Tomorrow) Girl Advisory Team. The girls provide the council with input on programming and publications and represent North Carolina Coastal Pines at regional and national meetings and conferences.

Growing Strong

Girl Scouts – North Carolina Coastal Pines is committed to helping girls grow strong, both physically and mentally. Through Girl Scouting, girls learn the importance of healthy, active living and test their physical limits with the guidance of dietitians, nurses, coaches, and college athletes at events throughout the year.

> Encouraging girls and their leaders to stay healthy by counting and logging daily steps and making healthy food choices, Girl Scouts – North Carolina Coastal Pines launched Make Every Step Count, the council's new healthy living initiative made possible thanks to generous support from Blue Cross and Blue Shield of North Carolina Foundation, Carolina Hurricanes Kids N' Community Foundation, and Hospira. Tracking their progress online, girls and troops learn the importance of exercising daily and eating balanced meals.

> With continued funding from the Dove Self-Esteem Fund, Girl Scouts – North Carolina Coastal Pines helped to build girls' self-esteem through the uniquely MEI program. More than 1,300 girls ages 8-14 from low-resource communities met weekly with positive female role models, planned and carried out service projects, visited colleges and attended council-sponsored events, and enjoyed presentations by and interactions with local businesswomen.





Discovering the Outdoors

Girl Scout camp offers girls the opportunity to make new friends and at the same time learn about themselves. During the summer, 2,138 girls participated in seven weeks of exciting, themed activities at four resident camps: Camp Graham on Kerr Lake in Vance County, Camp Hardee on the Pamlico River in Beaufort County, Camp Mary Atkinson in Johnston County, and Camp Pretty Pond in Beaufort County. In addition, 1,548 campers enjoyed spending time in the outdoors at 17 day camps planned and led by a corps of dedicated local volunteers. Girl Scouts took full advantage of our camps throughout the year by participating in day and weekend events at all six of our camp properties.

- > Girls attending resident camp at Camp Pretty Pond ventured off the camp property to the nearby surf and sand. After spending a week taking surf lessons, the girls looked cool and confident as they caught a wave and got in the barrel.
- > Our Sweet Carolina Girls enjoyed a weekend of fun at the biannual Beaches, Basketball and Barbeque Hoedown at the Homestead Girl Scout Camp in Franklin County. Junior and teen Girl Scout troops from around the council joined fellow Girl Scouts for a great weekend of outdoor adventures ending with a special hoedown.
- > First-time campers visited Camp Mary Atkinson for an introductory overnight camping experience. Together with their troop, girls explored the property, discovered the great outdoors, and made new friends while roasting marshmallows over the campfire.



Enhancing Global Awareness

The Girl Scout Promise and Law provide a moral compass for girls and teach them to respect one another and the differences that define individuals and cultures. Girl Scouts participated in local, national, and global service projects and travelled across the country and around the world.

- > Girl Scouts from across the council spent the month of October 2006 making, collecting, and donating more than 7,500 new and clean, gently-used blankets. While delivering the much-needed blankets to local women's shelters, homeless shelters, foster homes, children's hospitals, animal shelters, and other community organizations, girls learned about the needs in our communities.
- > Two local Girl Scouts joined a group of teen girls and advisors from across the world for an experience of a lifetime. The girls traveled to Sangam, India, one of four Girl Scout World Centers, for a week of meditation. The group dined on traditional vegetarian cuisine, experienced Indian culture, and practiced yoga daily.
- > Teen Girl Scouts looked globally when selecting Girl Scout Gold Award projects. One Girl Scout Gold Award recipient worked to eradicate illiteracy in remote parts of India while another assisted with a bilingual program at an elementary school in Costa Rica. Yet another Girl Scout Gold Awardee created a dental hygiene program for an orphanage in Lithuania.



Celebrating Achievements

Girl Scouts – North Carolina Coastal Pines takes great pride in recognizing the outstanding accomplishments of the young women who earn the Girl Scout Bronze, Silver, and Gold Awards each year. This year, 539 Junior Girl Scouts received the Girl Scout Bronze Award, and 150 Cadette Girl Scouts, ages 11-14, attained the Girl Scout Silver Award. Additionally, 50 Senior Girl Scouts, ages 14-18, earned the Girl Scout Gold Award, the highest award in Girl Scouting. The award recognizes outstanding accomplishment in community service, leadership development, career exploration, and personal growth. Congratulations to our Girl Scout Gold Award recipients for meeting their personal challenges and achieving their goals while serving our community.

Megan George, a 2006 Girl Scout Gold Award recipient from Raleigh, was honored nationally by Girl Scouts of the USA as a Girl Scout Gold Award Young Woman of Distinction for her extraordinary leadership and community service. For her Girl Scout Gold Award project, "Starting Equal and Falling Behind," Megan worked with 45 students ages five to 12 on hands-on science experiments and implemented a back-to-school informational conference. Her conference included speakers and interactive sessions on closing the growing achievement gap in the public school system. She involved community leaders, students, parents, and ministers in her effort to increase awareness for the cause. Megan was honored in June 2007 at the formal celebration of Girl Scouts' 95th anniversary in Washington, DC.



Reaching Goals

Through the Girl Scout Cookie Sale Program, girls learned skills to lead them into the economic marketplace. Selling an average of 198 boxes of cookies each, girls gained hands-on experience in accounting, marketing, business etiquette, and goal setting. North Carolina Coastal Pines' Girl Scouts sold 2,543,928 boxes of the delicious treats. While the sale grossed \$8.4 million, troops and girls netted more than \$1.3 million in troop proceeds and recognitions, and the council netted \$3.4 million.

Our Volunteers



Helping our girls grow strong, 9,836 adult volunteers held various roles throughout the council. This year, council trainers led 566 leadership and enrichment courses for 1,843 trained leaders and co-leaders from all 41 counties. Additionally, Girl Scouts – North Carolina Coastal Pines offered a home study training option for basic leadership and program age level courses. More than 250 volunteers successfully completed these online courses. Instruction offered by Girl Scouts – North Carolina Coastal Pines, both face to face and virtually, contributes to the growth and satisfaction of a Girl Scout volunteer and in turn, contributes to the growth of girls.

Council Realignment

On September 29, 2007, 160 delegates, board members, and volunteers gathered at Camp Mary Atkinson for the Girl Scouts – North Carolina Coastal Pines Special Meeting. The celebratory day marked more than a year of hard work and dedication of the Council Realignment Committee and realignment volunteers as delegates from the legacy councils approved the merger of the Girl Scout Council of Coastal Carolina and Pines of Carolina Girl Scout Council.

Thanks Badge

Girl Scouts – North Carolina Coastal Pines was pleased to honor several long-time volunteers and friends of Girl Scouting with the Thanks Badge and Thanks Badge II. These awards are the highest an adult can receive and are awarded for truly outstanding service that benefits the total council or the entire Girl Scout movement. 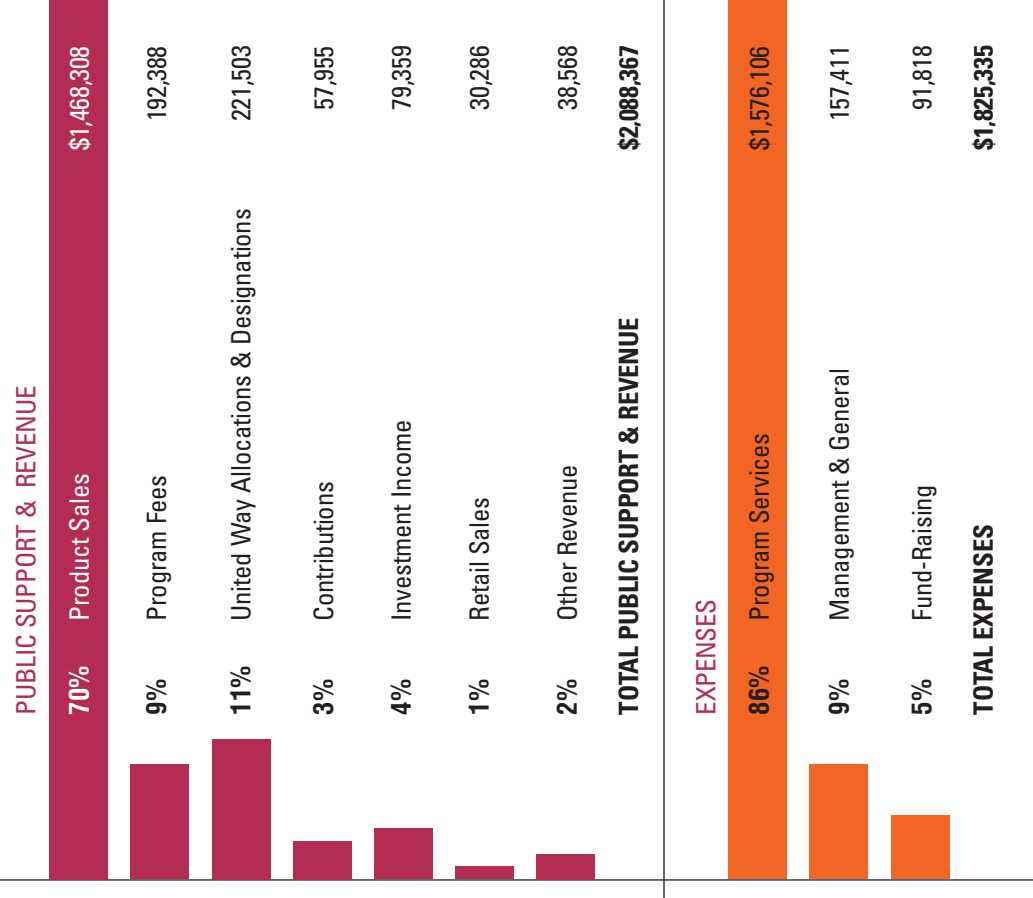
