Each year outstanding girl leaders are identified to serve as girl board members for the council's board of directors. Board members participate in developing strategic direction and goals for the council and understand and support the council mission, policy and basic philosophy of the Girl Scout Movement. The board meets about six times a year (see dates below). If selected to serve in this capacity, you would get to develop leadership qualities and skills while discovering the impact you can have as a leader!

Attendance, preparation and active participation in board meetings are expectations of all board members – girl and adult. If selected to serve as a girl board member, you must commit yourself to this responsibility.
