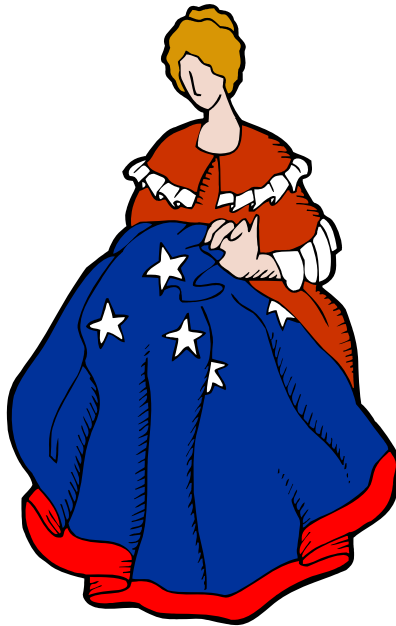

## **Program Information**

Moore's Creek National Battlefield is accessible from Wilmington, NC by US Highway 421, from Raleigh by I-40 and NC Highway 53, from Fayetteville by NC Highway 87 or NC Highway 210, and from Whiteville by US Highway 74. The park is open 9:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m. daily, except on December 25<sup>th</sup> and January 1<sup>st</sup>. Girl Scouts are welcome to use our picnic area and activity field.

## **Obtaining the Moore's Creek Battlefield Heroic Women Patch**
