Adult Training Opportunities - New Online Registration Site - Adult training registration is no longer available through the Council Web site. Visit our new [C.O.R.E.](#) (Council Online Registration Events) site to register.

There is a link to this new site on the Council Web site's homepage. This site will be used for all adult training and Leaderee registrations. Payment for trainings/events (if applicable) can be made by Visa, Mastercard, Discover or American Express.

When you first visit the site, you'll need to activate your web access. You already have a profile in the system (attached to your membership). There is no need to create a new profile. Simply click on Activate Account and when you get to the new screen, scroll down and enter your first name, last name, and email address on file with the council. You will be directed to "Create a User Name and Password". Once you do this, you can register for any upcoming training by clicking on Adult Training and Events and making your selection. If you have any problems activating your web access, please email helpdesk@nccoastalpines.org and describe the problem your having in detail (i.e. error messages, screenshot of issue, etc.)

This site will also be where troops can reregister members for Early Bird registration for 2011 and parents can register their girls for Resident Camp.

Girl Scouts and Haiti Earthquake Relief Efforts - Our thoughts and prayers continue to be with the people of Haiti, their friends and families. Given these recent events, the National Board of Girl Scouts of the USA (GSUSA) has made a decision to make it possible for members to raise funds for relief efforts in Haiti from January 14 through September 8, 2010. BEAUTY REDEFINED: Girls, Body Image & Fashion -This month Girl Scouts of the USA is releasing the results of a recent poll on girls, body image, fashion and media. The survey, conducted in November 2009, unearthed several interesting findings on the conflicted relationship between girls and fashion, and how they feel about the images portrayed to them. With ongoing public discussions on the fashion industry's use of ultra skinny models, GSUSA has decided to host a panel discussion to address the role of fashion and media in building positive self-esteem for girls. **This is not an attack on the fashion industry but rather an effort to amplify the voice of girls** - that girls, indeed, want to see more real and natural images presented in media and fashion. The VIP event will also be an opportunity to highlight our long-standing partnership with the Dove Self-Esteem Fund and our ongoing work in this area, including the forthcoming Journey 3 series *'It's Your Story - Tell It!'* (releasing December 2010). This survey was timed to support our role as the leading organization in creating positive self-esteem among girls. From *diets to celebrities, diversity to fashion*, the event will be an open platform for the much-needed discussion on self-esteem and girls, with a focus on what role we can *all* play to help them define real beauty.

- o To register for resident camp, please use this system. We encourage you to log into this system before registration starts on February 17th to activate your account.
- o All girls will have their own account - this means that if there are three girls in your family, then they will each have an account that is unique to them (i.e. three girls, three separate accounts, each needs to be activated)
- o Things you will need to log into the system are:
 - *First Name
 - *Last Name
 - *Email address used at time of registration (for GS-NCCP members this email account is the one you submitted on your last registration form)

Sponsorship Opportunity for Conservation and Fly Fishing Youth Camp - For several years, Triangle Fly Fishers has sponsored a camper to attend the NC Trout Unlimited Rivercourse, a coldwater conservation and fly fishing youth camp. The week-long camp, June 20-25, 2010, is held at Lake Logan Center in Canton, North Carolina. This year Triangle Fly Fishers would like to sponsor a Girl Scout from North Carolina Coastal Pines for this camp. Sponsorship will include the cost of tuition (\$595/camper). The girl will be responsible for transportation to and from the camp and any incidentals. Rivercourse is a program for both boys and girls ages 13 to 15 years old. Participation is limited to 16 campers. Campers are introduced to cold water fisheries conservation while learning the basics of fly-fishing, such as casting, fly tying, proper equipment, streamside etiquette, knot tying and how to find fish. Campers are taught by adult volunteers in specialized fields such as herpetology (amphibians), geology, entomology (insects), botany, wetlands ecology, stream restoration techniques and environmental stewardship.
