It's Girl Scout Week!

Yesterday Governor Beverly Perdue has proclaimed the week of March 7-13 as Girl Scout Week in North Carolina. As part of Girl Scout Advocacy day, Linda Carlisle, North Carolina's Secretary of Cultural Resources and a Girl Scout volunteer presented the proclamation to the girls and the legislators. Advocacy day was also a chance for 20 teen Girl Scouts from all across the state to join women legislators at the General Assembly to share a box lunch and talk about their lives and the issues they face. The girls learned first-hand what issues are facing the Legislature, what it's like to run for public office, and how the women balance their family and their professional lives. In return, the elected officials got the chance to hear from the girls what issues are important to today's young women. Also this week Girl Scouts are serving as pages to the Governor's office, and both programs are part of the Girl Scout Leadership training experience.

Take advantage of additional events during the remainder of Girl Scout Week:

Girl Scout Sabbath, March 13: give girls an opportunity to attend their place of worship and be recognized as a Girl Scout. If a place of worship is the group sponsor, girls may perform a service, such as greeting, ushering, or doing a flag ceremony. These days can also be a time when girls explore other faiths. Celebrating these days also gives Girl Scouting opportunities 1) to thank places of worship for their contributions to the community and to Girl Scouting, and 2) to share how today's girls are discovering their personal paths to leadership through Girl Scouting.

Girl Scout Birthday, March 12: To commemorate March 12, 1912, when Juliette Gordon Low officially registered the organization's first 18 girl members as Girl Scouts in Savannah, Georgia.

In addition to the activities above, Girl Scout Week is the last official week of the 2010 Girl Scout Cookie sale, which ends on Sunday, March 14. Great job to all who have sold cookies this year!

Martha Webb - Martha A. Webb Every Girl, Everywhere Fund - At the conclusion of the meeting, the creation of the Martha A. Webb Every Girl, Everywhere Fund was announced to honor the lifelong service of our outgoing Board Chair. It will allow deserving girls in our council to attend activities that they would otherwise not be able to due to financial restraints. Contributions to the Martha A. Webb Every Girl Everywhere Fund will provide much-needed financial assistance for girls. By removing financial barriers to their participation, last year 17,170 girls from under-resourced families and communities experienced the benefits of our life-changing program. The cost of providing financial assistance for

annual Girl Scout membership dues alone was \$172,000 this past year, and the council awarded more than \$38,000 to help girls attend camp, broaden their horizons through travel, and experience council-sponsored events.
