Skills you can use!

No matter what position you are interested in you will learn and use a variety of skills that are career oriented. According to the American Camp Association “Business executives often note that experience as a camp counselor translates into excellent management and personnel skills.”

Some responsibilities will vary based on the position, but each role will help you to become more proficient in the following skills:

Supervision– All staff have supervision responsibilities to varying degrees. Staff are responsible for the campers’ care and well-being 24 hours a day, whether in the pool or in the unit. Some staff will also be responsible for supervising other camp staff. Camp is a great way to gain or enhance your supervision skills.

Creativity– Camp staff work to make everyday experiences new and imaginative to our campers. Whether it’s turning your hike around camp into a safari adventure or modifying an activity to make it more inclusive for all campers, you can let your creative juices flow! All jobs require some out of the box thinking– a trait that is valuable to many employers.



Planning and Organization– Planning and organization are an integral part of the success of camp. Staff work in groups to make plans for the future weeks of camp, get supplies ready, and organize their daily schedules. Organization is a skill that will be honed at camp by every staff member.

Risk Management– Our number one goal at camp is safety. Each member is trained in first aid and

CPR, as well as, the crisis management plans developed by the Girl Scout council. One of the main roles of all camp staff is identifying potentially dangerous situations and being proactive to reduce risk.

Customer Service– As a camp, we supply a service to our campers and the daily management off the camp program is the responsibility of the entire staff. Staff will interact with parents and campers, who are our customers. Certain positions are more tailored to the business side of camp.

Communication Skills– A key factor to camp success is the exchanging of ideas and the interaction among staff members and our campers. Staff members must develop excellent communication skills in order to work with other staff and children. Camp positions will help you develop excellent ways of interacting within your field.

Teamwork– Camp staff work as a cohesive group within every aspect of camp. The teamwork skills that will be developed as a camp staff member will be vital in the work force.
