Purpose: To discover and practice more ways to carry out the Girl Scout Promise.

1. Start a scrapbook of poems, quotations, and pictures that illustrate: On my honor. I will try. To serve God. (To serve) my country and mankind.
2. Learn from Girl Scout books a grace to sing and a song for patriotic occasions.
3. Find out about customs of different religious faiths that affect holidays, food, and activities, so that you can respect the beliefs of other Scouts when planning activities with them.
4. Explain how the second part of the Promise—To serve “my country and mankind”—is connected with the Girl Scout motto, “Be Prepared,” and the slogan, “Do a good turn daily.”
5. Watch to see the many things people do to help each other. Make up charades, shadowgraphs, or a skit to show some of the things that you observed which you are going to do.
6. Make a list of ways you will try to live up to the Law. Write the Law. Then think about everything you did in one day and list beside each part of the Law those things in which that part of the Law helped you decide how to act. OR Cut from newspapers and magazines pictures or stories that illustrate each part of the Law, and explain why you chose the pictures and stories.
7. Do one or more service projects that would carry out the Promise.
