

Daisy's Dozen Troop Program Year Assessment Tool

The Daisy's Dozen Program Year Assessment Tool is an online assessment that is implemented annually to collect information that staff and administrative volunteers use to make informed decisions about future programmatic support to ensure girls are receiving an enriching Girl Scout experience based on the Girl Scout Leadership Experience, and that leaders have the support and resources they need.

As part of the assessment, we incorporate an opportunity for 12 troops each year to be selected to receive recognition as a Daisy's Dozen Elite Troop for going above and beyond in their experiences while also meeting 12 criteria points as outlined in the assessment. The 12 selected Daisy's Dozen Elite troops will receive special council-wide recognition throughout the upcoming year.



The Annual Assessment:

- Covers activities between October 1 and May 15
- Is open from April 16– June 1
- Earns free Daisy's Dozen fun patches to troops that submit it by June 1
- Provides the opportunity for troops that submit it by June 1 to be eligible for Daisy's Dozen Elite status
- Can only be accessed through a coleaders VTK account and is found under the Resource tab
- Takes on average 15-20 minutes to complete and must be done in one sitting
