

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# Camp Overview

## Properties at a Glance

### **Camp Graham**

**334 REGIONAL WATER LANE, HENDERSON, NC 27537**

Camp Graham is located on Kerr Lake in Vance County, North Carolina. Here, campers can explore 155 acres of forest, lake coves, and fields. Camp Graham has a semi-private cove for canoeing, kayaking, and sailing. There are many open spaces at camp that can be used for large group activities. For weekend camping, Camp Graham can house 206 campers in two tent units, three cabin units, a CIT hut, and a staff house. Resident camp and troop/group camp are currently conducted at Camp Graham during the summer months.

### **Camp Hardee**

**752 CAMP HARDEE ROAD, BLOUNTS CREEK, NC 27814**

Camp Hardee is southeast of Chocowinity and Washington, North Carolina, on the south side of the Pamlico River. The site consists of 96 acres with river frontage, woodlands, and some open spaces that can be used for large group activities. The camp can accommodate 96 campers. All buildings and activity areas are within easy walking distance.

### **Camp Mary Atkinson**

**8591 NC HWY 42 EAST, SELMA, NC 27576**

Camp Mary Atkinson (CMA) is in Johnston County, east of Clayton, North Carolina. At Camp Mary Atkinson, campers can explore 278 acres of property, which includes a swimming pool, a pond for boating, trails, and the Leadership Center. It has the capacity to hold 204 campers in two cabin units, three tent units, and a staff house. There are many buildings that can be used for programming and gathering of large groups. Resident camp is currently conducted at CMA during the summer months.

### **Camp Mu-Sha-Ni**

**218 SYCAMORE LANE, JACKSON SPRINGS, NC 27281**

Camp Mu-Sha-Ni is in Richmond County; about 10 miles west of Aberdeen, near Derby, and is part of an area in North Carolina known as the Sandhills. Here, campers can explore 843 acres of fields, forest, ponds, and wetlands. Camp Mu-Sha-Ni has accommodations for 166 campers. There are six platform tent units and two buildings at Mu-Sha-Ni; plus, an Encampment Field that has space for 300 more people for tent camping. The Troop House and Chalfant Shelter are equipped with heat and air for year-round camping comfort.

# Information Regarding Reservations

## Lodging Reservations

- Check-in for lodging is at 2:00 p.m. on arrival date. Arrival is permitted at any time after 2 p.m.
- Check-out for lodging is at 12 noon on check out date.
- Please refer to Safety Activity Checkpoints for details regarding sleeping accommodation.
- If there are males within your group, you will need to reserve the entire unit to ensure separate accommodations for male attendees.

## Camp Graham

Camp Graham is located on Kerr Lake in Vance County. Here campers can explore 155 acres of forest, lake coves, and fields. Camp Graham has a semi-private cove for canoeing, kayaking, and sailing. For weekend camping, Camp Graham can house 206 campers in two tent units, three cabin units, a CIT hut and a staff house. ## Lodging Information

### Cardinal Cove: Platform Tents – Capacity 16



Cardinal Cove is located between the infirmary and the swinging bridge where you have a great view of the lake as well as the swimming and boating areas. The platform tents are kept cool during the hot summer by the constant lake breeze that blows through the tents. There are four tents that house four cots with mattresses in each tent. In the middle of the circle of tents is a fire circle for cooking, with a picnic table located nearby. There are outdoor showers close to the unit. During the summer, portable toilets are added, but the camp's main restrooms are just a short walk from the unit. When staying in this unit other times of the year, the restroom and shower are located in the infirmary next to it. **Closed in the**

**winter and summer.**

### CIT Cabin: Cabin – Capacity 10

The CIT Cabin is located next to the Dining Hall near the trees. The sleeping areas are located at each end of the cabin, with the shower and toilet located in the middle. The cabin has bunk beds with mattresses. It is great for a small group outing. A small fire ring and benches are located behind the cabin for cooking or s'mores. New in 2021- the CIT cabin now has heat and air conditioning.

**Closed in the winter and summer.**



### Cloverfield Treehouses: Cabins – Capacity 36 in cabins (8 in platform tents)



There are six elevated cabins, each named for a native North Carolina tree – Maple, Oak, Poplar, Hickory, Longleaf, and Dogwood. Each cabin sleeps six, with two bunk beds and two cots with mattresses, a bench, and a ceiling fan. The unit's Brightleaf Program Shelter has electricity, tables, chairs, a fridge, and fans inside. The unit's outdoor space offers a number of picnic tables with grills and one fire circle to use for cooking or enjoying the fire for s'mores. Directly beneath the unit shelter is a shower house with four warm-water shower stalls and four handwashing sinks. The cabins are not heated, but the bathrooms are heated. The Cloverfield Treehouse Unit is ADA-compliant with a wheelchair lift and ramp. **Closed in summer.**

### Holly Hill: Cabins – Capacity 48

Holly Hill is nestled among trees within sight of Kerr Lake. There are seven cabins- Cabins 1, 6, and 7 have three sets of bunk beds and two cots with mattresses, and Cabins 2, 3, 4 and 5 have six cots with mattresses in each cabin. Each cabin has electricity and ceiling fans. The unit shelter has electricity, tables, chairs, fans, an indoor and outdoor fireplace, outside patio, and a refrigerator. There are two fire circles to use for cooking or enjoying the fire. The bathhouse has three toilets and three showers in the main bathroom and an ADA- compliant single-stall bathroom and shower. **Closed in the winter and summer.**





### **Infirmary: Cabin – Capacity 12**

Renovated in 2022, the Infirmary has two large rooms, and a small gathering area. There are six sets of bunk beds for a total of 12 beds. The building is heated and cooled. There is a restroom with a shower within the building. **Closed in the winter and summer.**

### **Staff House: Cabin – Capacity 20**



The Staff House is located next to the summer office on the main camp road, where you can see the lake from the front yard. The Staff House consists of an open room with a fireplace, tables, chairs, couches, a large TV and DVD player. The mattresses are kept in the storage closet and can be taken out and spread on the floor for sleeping. The Staff House also has a toilet, shower, and sink. Included in the kitchen are pots, pans, dishes, utensils, refrigerator, microwave, stove, dishwasher, and dishwashing sink. The Staff House is heated and a great place to be during the cold winter months. You can use the fireplace to keep warm.

On a nice night, you can take your fire outside at the fire circle and picnic tables. **Closed in summer.**

### **Trailblazer: Cabins – Capacity 42**

Trailblazer is among the trees; it is close enough to the main camp for comfort, yet far enough for some privacy. There are seven cabins with six cots with mattresses in each cabin. Each cabin has electricity and ceiling fans. The cabins form a circle around the unit shelter. The unit shelter has electricity, tables, chairs, indoor and outdoor fireplace, a refrigerator, and an outdoor patio. To the right, when you enter the unit, is an open-air shower house with four shower stalls, a multi-person sink, and a dishwashing sink. Farther back to the right of the unit shelter is the toilet house with four toilets and a hand-washing sink. Two fire circles and picnic tables are located within this unit. Trailblazer has a large open grassy field nearby for games, etc. **Closed in the winter and summer.**



### **Whippoorwill: Platform Tents – Capacity 40**



Whippoorwill is in the middle of the camp where all major buildings can be seen. You can hear the small waves of Kerr Lake coming to shore as you lay in your tent at night. This unit is ADA accessible and consists of ten platform tents each with four cots with mattresses. Also included in this unit is a unit shelter with electricity, tables, chairs, fans, indoor and outdoor fireplace, outside patio, and refrigerator. Located behind the unit shelter is an open-air shower house with four showers, multi-faucet trough-style sink, and dishwashing sink. Farther behind the shower house is the toilet house with four flush toilets. One tent, toilet, and shower are ADA accessible. **Closed in the winter and summer.**

## General Usage Areas

### Rentable



#### Archery Range

The Archery Range is located between Cloverfield and Trailblazer Units. The Archery Range is available for rental from a certified archery leader. Our Archery Range has four targets: several adult-sized left and right-handed compound and recurve bows and several youth-sized left and right-handed compound and recurve bows. The Archery Range can be reserved only if someone with the group has USA Archery's Level 1 certification (or higher), or if you are requesting assistance from GSNCCP for a certified individual. Refer to Safety

Activity Checkpoints for requirements. The Archery Range is reservable in time blocks and entire day rentals.



#### Axe Range

The Axe Range is located near the archery range between Cloverfield and Trailblazer Units. New in 2023, the Axe Range provides four lanes that can be used to learn all about Axe Throwing. The Axe Range can be reserved only if someone with the group has GSNCCP Axe Facilitator certification, or if you are requesting assistance from GSNCCP for a certified

individual. Refer to Safety Activity Checkpoints for requirements. The Axe Range is reservable in time blocks and entire day rentals.

### Commercial Kitchen



The commercial kitchen must be reserved separately, and groups must provide proof of NC ServSafe Certification, NC Food Handler, or official commercial kitchen training. **Closed in the winter and summer.**

### Dining Hall: Building – Capacity 100



The Dining Hall is a focal point for camp with room for 100 people. It is a great place for large groups to check in campers and can also accommodate larger group activities. Community restrooms are located outside of the dining hall. **Closed in the winter and summer.**



## Sirius Astronomy Hut



The Sirius Astronomy Hub is equipped with telescopes\*, star finders, binoculars, activities, and resource materials to help explore the night sky. **\*Please note** that telescope setup can take up to 30 minutes and that you must view the orientation video prior to use.

The Sirius Astronomy Hub is dedicated to Margaret “Peggy” Pickard Sirius, whose camp name became Sirius when one of her Centinela Valley colleagues commented: “Peggy was the brightest star in the sky.”

## Waterfront



Located on Kerr Lake, the semi-private cove provides a space for boating\* and swimming. The H-dock extends into the water and provides a great place to swim or fish. The equipment is in the Boat House on the hill facing the waterfront area. The waterfront area can be reserved only if someone with the group has GSNCCP watercraft training, waterfront lifeguarding, or if you are requesting assistance from GSNCCP for a certified individual. Refer to Safety Activity Checkpoints for requirements. At the tip of the waterfront is a large fire circle that can be used for group campfires while looking up at the beautiful night sky. The waterfront is reservable in time blocks and entire day rentals.



\*There are no facilities for launching boats that do not belong to Girl Scouts – North Carolina Coastal Pines. **Closed in the winter.**

## Included in Rentals



### Amphitheater

The Amphitheater is located just behind the main office, adjacent to the pathway leading to the Outdoor Shelter area. It has a large stage with power and log seating for 150 people. It is great for talent shows, songs, and skits. You can enjoy looking at the beautiful night sky in the field close by.

### Gaga Ball Pit

Gaga is a fast-paced, high-energy sport played in an octagonal pit. This game has been dubbed a kinder, gentler version of dodgeball. The gaga ball pit is located next to our tie-dye shelter in the main field.



### Swinging Bridge

At the far end of the semi-private cove, the swinging bridge connects Kay McGavran to the rest of camp. It's a great place to view the cove and the lake.

### Tie Dye Shelter

The Tie Dye Shelter is located on the big field behind the Amphitheater. This is the place for arts and crafts, especially the messy ones. This shelter has a gravel floor and a water spigot close by for easy clean up. Electricity is available.



### Trails


There are various trails that weave throughout the property. They are marked with trail signs and hikers can choose one or multiple trails to explore during their stay.

Camp Hardee is located southeast of Chocowinity and Washington, North Carolina, on the south side of the Pamlico River. The site consists of 96 acres with river frontage for canoeing, kayaking, and sailing, along with beautiful woodlands, a swimming pool, and open areas for large group activities. The camp has the capacity to accommodate 96 campers. All buildings and activity areas are close and within easy walking distance. Resident camp is currently conducted on this site in the summer months.

## Lodging Information

### Crisp Cabin – Capacity 8



Crisp Cabin is a 3-bedroom, 2-bathroom modular home. The building has heat and air conditioning, and a full kitchen equipped with a table and four chairs, an electric stove, refrigerator, freezer, microwave, dishwasher, coffee maker, mop, broom, and vacuum cleaner. Please note the kitchen can only be used to prepare food for up to eight individuals, due to Health Department regulations.



One bedroom has two bunk beds, and two bedrooms have two cots each. There is a living room with a couch. The bathrooms are standard household size. Charcoal grill and picnic tables are included outside, along with a shared fire circle. Crisp Cabin acts as the Camp Office and Infirmary during Resident Camp.

### Cabin 1: Hardee Hotel – Capacity 8



Cabin 1 includes four sets of bunk beds with mattresses. It has a wall HVAC unit for year-round camping. It also includes two charcoal grills and one picnic table. This cabin shares a community bathhouse with other user groups. This unit is heated.

### Cabin 2– Capacity 16

Cabin 2 includes eight sets of bunk beds with mattresses. This building is heated and air conditioned. This cabin is great for a larger group and for first time campers, since adults can share the cabin with campers in accordance with Safety Activity Checkpoints.



### Cabins 3 to 6: Unit 1 – Capacity 24 (8 per cabin)



Cabins 3, 4, 5, and 6 include four sets of bunk beds with mattresses. They are all air conditioned and heated. Cabins 3, 4, and 5 are clustered around a campfire circle, two shared grills, and picnic table. Unit 1 shares the community bathhouse with other user groups.

**Cabins 7 to 10: Unit 2 – Capacity 32 (8 per cabin)**



Cabins 7-10 are in one cluster. These cabins share a charcoal grill and three picnic tables within the Lowe's Shelter. Each cabin is equipped with heat and air conditioning for year-round camping. Outside water is available nearby. Unit 2 shares the community bathhouse with other user groups. Each cabin includes four sets of bunk beds with mattresses.

**Hammock Village– Capacity 14**

Enjoy a night under the stars in Hammock Village. There are enough posts to set up 12 hammocks. Hammocks can be provided, or campers can bring their own. Please note: Hammock Village is located near Eagle Nest and does not have bathrooms or water nearby and there are no covered areas here.



## General Usage Areas

### Rentable

#### Archery Range



There are four targets with a screen mesh that is pulled behind them to keep the arrows in the shooting range. There are recurve bows and compound bows available. In this area, there is a shelter with bench seating and mesh on the back to help keep out the sun. The Archery Range can be reserved only if someone with the group has USA Archery Level 1 certification (or higher), or if you are requesting assistance from GSNCCP for a certified individual. Refer to

Safety Activity Checkpoints for requirements. The Archery Range is reservable in time blocks and entire day rentals.

#### Axe Range

The Axe Range is located near the archery range. New in 2023, the Axe Range provides four lanes that can be used to learn all about Axe Throwing. The Axe Range can be reserved only if someone with the group has GSNCCP Axe Facilitator certification, or if you are requesting assistance from GSNCCP for a certified individual. Refer to Safety Activity Checkpoints for requirements. The Axe Range is reservable in time blocks and entire day rentals.



#### Craft Shelter

This is a screened-in shelter with three tables, twenty chairs, a sink (cold water\*), and a refrigerator/freezer. There are picnic tables nearby that you can expand into the outdoors to see the great views of the river.

\*Water is not available in the winter.

#### Edith Davenport Shelter



This is a screened-in shelter with four picnic tables and two charcoal grills outdoors. It is equipped with a refrigerator and a double sink with cold/hot water. It also includes electricity.



#### Rotary Lodge: Main Room – Capacity 100



This building consists of a large multi-purpose room that can be used as a meeting space with tables and chairs. There is a projector and mounted screen available to show movies and/or presentations. There is a DVD player provided, but not a computer. There is a bathroom off the main room with two sinks and two toilets. This building is not used for sleeping.



## Rotary Lodge: Commercial Kitchen



The commercial kitchen is only available with certification by North Carolina ServSafe License or NC Food Handler. The kitchen is equipped with a gas stove, prep tables, sinks, coffee maker, microwave, ice maker, and refrigerator/freezer. The kitchen must be rented separately.

## Swimming Pool – Capacity 110

The pool can be reserved for two-hour segments beginning at 8:00 a.m. until 10:00 p.m. The pool house has two toilets and five outdoor pull showers. The swimming pool is not ADA-accessible. Lifeguards are required to use the pool, or you may request assistance from GSNCCP. The pool must be reserved separately, not included in the entire camp rental. The swimming pool can be reserved in time blocks and entire day rentals. **Weather permitting, the pool is open from May 15 – September 15.**



## Waterfront – Pamlico River

The waterfront area has a magnificent view of the Pamlico River. There is a 150-foot pier with a T dock. The Waterfront area can be reserved only if someone with the group has GSNCCP Watercraft Training, waterfront lifeguarding, or if you are requesting assistance from GSNCCP for a certified individual. Refer to Safety Activity Checkpoints for requirements. There are Canoes, Kayaks, and Stand-Up Paddle Boards. Sail Boats are not rentable. The waterfront is not recommended for swimming, but if you choose to swim, you will need a waterfront lifeguard, and everyone is required to wear a PDF. The waterfront is available in time blocks and entire day rentals.



\*There are no facilities for launching boats that do not belong to Girl Scouts – North Carolina Coastal Pines.

## **Included in Rentals**

### **Eagles Nest**

This is the largest campfire circle at camp offering a great view of the Pamlico River. While there, be on the lookout for a great sunset and eagles! There is a stage and permanent bench seating.



### **East (Purple) Bathhouse**

This ADA-accessible community bathhouse must be shared. It is equipped with four warm water showers, three flush toilets, and four hand sinks. This bathhouse is heated.

### **Lowe's Shelter**

This shelter is located between the Unit 2 cabins and the swimming pool. The 20' X 30' activity shelter has three picnic tables. There is one charcoal grill and a campfire circle. There are lights and one outlet.

### **Main Camp Fire Circle**

This campfire circle is located next to the Crisp Cabin. There is a stage and movable benches in this area.

### **West (Yellow) Bathhouse**




It is equipped with four warm water showers, four flush toilets, and two hand sinks. This bathhouse is heated. Plus, the single bathroom is ADA-accessible with a toilet, hand sink, and shower. This community bathhouse must be shared.

## Lodging Information

### Coyote Hill – Capacity 20

Coyote Hill Tents are situated just up the hill and within sight of Fox Leap and can be added to Fox Leap when extra space is needed. The five platform tents with screening each have four cots with mattresses. The unit shelter sits in the middle of the tents and has electricity, a refrigerator, and a picnic table. There are two ground grills for cooking and a fire circle behind the shelter towards the woods. It shares toilet and shower facilities with the Fox Leap unit. The bathhouse has three toilets and three showers in the main bathroom and an ADA- compliant single-stall bathroom and shower **Closed in the winter and summer.**



### Fox Leap – Capacity 28



Fox Leap has seven platform tents with screening and four cots with mattresses that form a semi-circle around the fire circle. The unit shelter has electricity, a fireplace, picnic tables, and a refrigerator. The unit has four toilets, four warm water showers, and a hand-washing sink. There are four ground grills for cooking. Fox Leap is shaded by a canopy of hardwood and pine trees and is located near the lake. The Fox Leap unit shares the washhouse with Coyote Hill. The bathhouse has three toilets and three showers in the main bathroom and an ADA- compliant single-stall bathroom and shower **Closed in the winter and summer.**

### Lady Slipper – Capacity 40

Lady Slipper has ten platform tents with screening and four cots with mattresses. The tents circle around the unit shelter, which has a fireplace in each, picnic tables, and a refrigerator. The bathhouse has three toilets and three showers in the main bathroom and an ADA- compliant single-stall bathroom and shower. The fire circle is next to the unit shelter, there are four ground grills for cooking close by. This unit is located nearest to the Alpine Tower trail. Lady Slipper rests beneath a mixture of large pine and oak trees that provide shade during the long summer days. There is one tent that is ADA-accessible. **Closed in the winter and summer.**



### **Owl Hollow – Capacity 60**



Owl Hollow cabins have ceiling fans, lights, a covered porch, heating, and air conditioning. The unit has five cabins, each with three bunk beds and six cots with mattresses. The unit shelter is enclosed with electricity and has a refrigerator, fireplace, heating and air conditioning. The bathhouse has four toilets, four showers, two outdoor showers, and five hand-washing sinks, and is heated for the winter season. This unit has picnic tables, four ground grills for cooking, and a fire circle. Owl Hollow is located in the shade of large hardwood trees that are common throughout the camp, and it is a short hike to the river or lake from this unit. This is an ADA-

accessible unit. **Closed in the summer.**

### **Raccoon Loft – Capacity 36**

Raccoon Loft has six cabins with six cots and mattresses in each. The cabins have electricity and lights and are divided by the unit shelter and bathhouse. The unit shelter has a fireplace, picnic tables, and a refrigerator. The bathhouse has three toilets and three showers in the main bathroom and an ADA-compliant single-stall bathroom and shower. There are four ground grills for cooking and a fire circle. This unit is shaded by huge oak trees and is located between the lake and the activity field. **Closed in the winter and summer.**



### **Staff House – Capacity 20**



The Staff House consists of an open room with a fireplace, tables, chairs, and couches. The mattresses are kept in the storage closet and can be taken out and spread on the floor for sleeping. The Staff House also has two toilets, one shower, two sinks, and cubby shelving for campers to store small items. Included in the full kitchen are pots, pans, dishes, utensils, refrigerator, microwave, noncommercial stove, and a dishwashing sink. The Staff House is a great place to be during the cold winter months, with the HVAC system and the fireplace. Located behind the Staff House are a fire circle, two grills, and two picnic tables. **Closed in the summer.**

## Encampment Field



The Encampment Field has been designated for groups who would like to bring and pitch their own tents at camp. Come and enjoy the full experience of outdoor camping as you sleep underneath the stars. The area has an open-air shelter with picnic tables and water near your fire circle. There is an above-ground grill available for cooking. The unit is located next to the Arianism. The bathhouse for this area is located at the Pool House. **Closed in the winter and summer.**

## General Usage Areas

### Rentable

#### Airnasium

The Airnasium provides a covered outdoor space that is perfect to keep the rain and sun away. The nearby shed has equipment for basketball, volleyball, and more stored inside. This area is not available to reserve and is to be shared by others at camp. It is located next to the Encampment Field.



#### Alpine Tower and Grotto



The Alpine Tower is a 50 ft. climbing tower that multiple campers can climb simultaneously. All Girl Scouts – North Carolina Coastal Pines Alpine Tower practices must be followed. Use of the Alpine Tower requires reservation and adherence to all Safety Activity Checkpoints guidelines regarding challenge courses. Climbers must be 4th grade or older to participate. There must be a council-approved lead facilitator and at least one other trained belayer for any tower event. Groups reserving the tower need to complete the Area Usage Form to help secure facilitators. Additional fees will apply. Assumption of risks and

authorization of emergency services must be completed and submitted to the facilitator on the day of the scheduled climb. No one will be able to climb without a completed waiver.

The Grotto is an 864 square-foot, six-sided bouldering structure. The walls are nine feet tall with hand and foot holds for climbing. No specialized equipment or certification is required. All age groups may use the Grotto, but they must be supervised by an adult troop leader. This leader will need to ensure that all climbers are spotted. Follow the Safety Activity Checkpoints for Challenge Courses or Climbing & Repelling and observe posted signs when using the Grotto. Troops and groups must share the Grotto with Alpine Tower users. There is no fee to use this equipment.

#### Archery Range



The range can have up to five targets. Both compound and recurve bow with arrow are available. In this area there is a shelter with bench seating. The Archery Range can be reserved only if someone with the group has USA Archery Level 1 (or higher) or if you are requesting assistance from GSNCCP for a certified individual. Refer to Safety Activity Checkpoints for requirements. The Archery Range is reservable in time blocks and entire day rentals.

## Axe Range



The Axe Range is located near the archery range. New in 2023, our Axe Range provides four lanes that can be used to learn all about Axe throwing. The Axe Range can be reserved only if someone with the group has GSNCCP Axe Facilitator Certification or if you are requesting assistance from GSNCCP for a certified individual. Refer to Safety Activity Checkpoints for requirements. The Axe Range is reservable in time blocks and an entire day rental.

## Craft Hut – Capacity 30

The Craft Hut includes a screened-in shelter with lights, electricity, water, tables, and benches. Groups must bring their own craft material. **Water is off in the winter and the hut is closed in the summer.**



## Leadership Center- Commercial Kitchen

Commercial kitchen is only available when supervised by someone with a North Carolina ServSafe or Food Handler License. Groups must provide supervision and a copy of the certificate. The Leadership Center can also be utilized by outside groups during the week from September to May and other times when not in use by Girl Scout groups.

## Leadership Center- Main Building – Capacity 200



The 16,000 square-foot building includes a large meeting room (150 chairs at tables-plus 50 additional chairs if needed), a stage, a stacked stone fireplace, a screened-in porch with fireplace, and restrooms which are all located upstairs. The lower level has three conference rooms, restrooms, an outdoor fireplace and patio. All meeting rooms have audio-visual equipment and

screens for your convenience (computers not provided). The building may be reserved for a minimum of 75 people and a maximum of 200 people for meetings, training, and activities. This is an ADA-accessible building.

**Closed in the summer.**



## Program Building – Capacity 100



Renovated in 2021, the Program Building is a great place for large group gatherings with tables and chairs. The building has a large gathering room, a small classroom, catering kitchen, and a three-stall bathroom as well as a single stall bathroom. The **large gathering** room offers a spectacular view of the lake and a beautiful stone fireplace, additionally it has sound system and projector capabilities. The **classroom** fits up to ten participants, with a sink and projector. The spacious **Catering Kitchen** has is equipped with basic cookware, has a large capacity

fridge, freezer, icemaker, two dishwashers, two microwaves, and two stoves. **Outdoor Amenities** include a fire circle, outdoor covered area with a picnic table, and outdoor sink.

### **Swimming Pool – Capacity 135**

Zero entry to 5-foot depth, ADA accessible. The pool can be reserved for two-hour segments beginning at 8:00 a.m.- 7 p.m. Refer to Safety Activity Checkpoints for requirements. **Weather permitting, the pool is open from May 15 – September 15. The pool is not available for troop or group use during resident camp.**



The Pool House is ADA accessible and has eight warm water showers, eight toilets and sinks. The Pool House can be divided into male and female by locking doors in the middle. The covered shelter has picnic tables and a hand washing sink. Phone available in shelter area for EMERGENCY 911 calls only.

### **Waterfront Area**



The waterfront area has a dock, a fish hut, and covered picnic tables for the swimming area. The boat house is located at one end where the boats are stored with a beach entry for water access. The Waterfront area can be reserved only if someone with the group has GSNCCP Watercraft Training, waterfront lifeguarding, or if you are requesting assistance from GSNCCP for a certified individual. Refer to Safety Activity Checkpoints for requirements. There are Canoes, Kayaks, and Stand-Up Paddle Boards. If swimming is an activity you would like to do, you will need a Waterfront

lifeguard, and everyone is required to wear a PDF. The waterfront is available in time blocks and entire day rentals.

\*There are no facilities for launching boats that do not belong to Girl Scouts – North Carolina Coastal Pines.

## **Included in Rentals**

### **Lakefront Fire circle**

The fire circle is located by the pond and there are no bathrooms available in that area.

### **Trails**

There are various trails that weave throughout the property. They are marked with trail signs and hikers can choose one or multiple trails to explore during their stay.

### **Gaga Ball Pit**


Gaga Ball is a fast-paced, high-energy sport played in an octagonal pit. Gaga ball has been dubbed a kinder, gentler version of dodgeball.

## Camp Mu-Sha-Ni

218 SYCAMORE LANE, JACKSON SPRINGS, NC 27281

Camp Mu-Sha-Ni is located in Richmond County; west of Aberdeen, near Derby, and is part of an area in North Carolina known as the Sandhills. Here, campers can explore 843 acres of fields, forest, ponds, and wetlands. Camp Mu-Sha-Ni has accommodations for 166 campers. There are six platform tent units and two buildings at Mu-Sha-Ni; plus, an Encampment Field that has space for 300 more people for tent camping. The Troop House and Chalfant Shelter are equipped with heat and air for year-round camping comfort.

## Lodging Information

### Chalfant Shelter Unit: – Capacity 16



Chalfant Shelter is located on the far side of the pond away from the other units and is ADA accessible. The Chalfant Shelter has one main room that is heated and air conditioned. There are mattresses in the building and can be placed on the floor for sleeping. A fireplace, refrigerator, oven, and microwave are available for use. Folding tables and chairs, picnic tables, charcoal grills, fire circles, and water faucets. A toilet/shower facility is just a few steps away from the covered porch area. Also located nearby is a fire circle, a shelter with benches, lights

and electricity. **Available year-round.**

### Troop House: – Capacity 50 Day Use/30 Overnight

The Troop House is a beautiful modern building overlooking the camp's pond. The Troop House is ADA accessible with ramps connecting to each end of a wrap-around porch. Rocking chairs are located on the porch to help you relax and enjoy the lakeside view. Inside is approximately 2,400 square feet of heated/cooled space that includes a large open room where mattresses are available and can be placed on the floor for sleeping.

Tables and chairs are located in a closet next to the common room. There are many windows and dormers for extra lighting from above. A large fireplace adorns one end of the common room with furniture for your comfort and relaxation. The kitchen contains all the amenities of the home – three ovens, a dishwasher, a microwave, a commercial refrigerator, and a small freezer. There are three toilets and three hand-washing sinks in one room and a unisex ADA-accessible shower/toilet/hand-washing sink in another. Also nearby is the Troop House shelter, with benches and electricity. **Available year-round.**



### Blue Bird Unit: Platform Tents – Capacity 20



Blue Bird is located between the parking lot and Encampment Field, close to the large bathhouse. The Blue Bird unit can be used for a group of 20 or less or combined with Red Bird to accommodate up to 40 campers or combined with Red Bird and Fox Squirrel Den for 52 campers. The Red Bird and Blue Bird Units are close enough for comfort but far enough for privacy when needed. One shelter is located close to the Blue Bird Unit—with a brick charcoal grilling area, picnic tables, a fire circle, and a water spigot. The other shelter is located between the Blue Bird and Red Bird Units. Electric outlets, lights, fans, picnic tables, benches, and charcoal

grills. **Closed in the winter.**

### Fox Squirrel Den Unit: Platform Tents – Capacity 12

Fox Squirrel Den is located at the corner of the Encampment Field. Three platform tents each contain four cots with mattresses. An open shelter that is close by, and water, picnic tables, fire circle, and charcoal cooking grill are available for use. The Fox Squirrel Den unit can be used for a group of 12 (or less) or combined with Red Bird and Blue Bird units to accommodate up to 52 campers. **Closed in the winter.**



### **Painted Tree Unit: Platform Tents – Capacity 12**



Painted Tree is located at the far end of the Encampment Field, nestled in young hardwood/pine woodlot trees. There are three platform tents, each containing four cots with mattresses. Available close to this unit is a small fire circle, charcoal grill, picnic table, and water spigot. **Closed in the winter.**

### **Red Bird Unit: Platform Tents – Capacity 20**

Red Bird is located between the parking lot and Encampment Field, not far from the bathhouse. The Red Bird Unit can be used for a group of 20 or less or combined with Blue Bird to accommodate up to 40 campers or combine with Blue Bird and Fox Squirrel Den for 52 campers. The Red Bird and Blue Bird Units are close enough for comfort but far enough for privacy when needed. There is a unit shelter with electrical outlets, lights, fans, picnic tables, benches, charcoal grills, water spigot, and a large fire circle that is shared with Blue Bird Unit. **Closed in the winter.**




### **Spotted Fawn Unit: Platform Tents – Capacity 16**



Spotted Fawn is located just past Turkey Hollow toward the far end of the Encampment Field, where four tents are grouped together among the trees each with four cots with mattresses. The unit includes a small fire circle and charcoal cooking grill, picnic tables, and water spigots. There is also a unit shelter with electric outlets, lights, fans, picnic tables, benches, and cooking grills located within this unit. The Spotted Fawn Unit can be used for a group of 16 or less or combined with Turkey Hollow Unit to accommodate up to 56 campers. **Closed in the winter.**

### **Turkey Hollow Unit: Platform Tents – Capacity 40**



Turkey Hollow is located on the far side of the five-acre Encampment Field with a group of ten tents nestled among the trees. There is one platform tent that is ADA-accessible. Each tent has four cots and mattresses. Turkey Hollow has an open-unit shelter with electric outlets, lights, and fans. There are picnic tables, benches, cooking grills, water faucets, a water hose, and a large fire circle available within this unit. The Turkey Hollow Unit can be used for a group of 40 or less or combined with Spotted Fawn Unit to accommodate up to 56 campers. **Closed in the winter.**

## Encampment Field

The Encampment Field is approximately five acres of open grassed area with a flagpole in the center. Multiple fire circles and water faucets are scattered around the perimeter of this field. There is room for 300 campers in the Encampment Field area where campers bring/pitch their own tents. Encampment field campers have access to the community bathhouse. Portable toilets are available for large events (events must be larger than 250 people). **Closed in the winter.**

### Rentable

#### Archery Range



The range can have up to five targets. Both compound and recurve bow with arrow are available. In this area there is a shelter with bench seating. The Archery Range can be reserved only if someone with the group has USA Archery Level 1 (or higher) or if you are requesting assistance from GSNCCP for a certified individual. Refer to Safety Activity Checkpoints for requirements. The Archery Range is reservable in time blocks and entire day rentals.

#### Axe Range

The Axe Range is located near the archery range. New in 2022, the Axe Range provides four lanes that can be used to learn all about Axe Throwing. The Axe Range can be reserved only if someone with the group has GSNCCP Axe Facilitator Certification or if you are requesting assistance from GSNCCP for a certified individual. Refer to Safety Activity Checkpoints for requirements. The Axe Range is reservable in time blocks and an entire day rental.



### Waterfront

Enjoy canoeing and kayaking on Camp Mu-Sha-Ni Pond. This is a great place to try your hand at paddling. There is also a swimming dock located on the pond. The Waterfront area can be reserved only if someone with the group has GSNCCP Watercraft Training, waterfront lifeguarding, or if you are requesting assistance from GSNCCP for a certified individual. Refer to Safety Activity Checkpoints for requirements.

## Included in Rentals

### Community Bathhouse



The large shower/restrooms building is convenient to all units around the Encampment Field and is ADA accessible. There are eight showers and toilets and 11 hand-washing sinks with four automatic hand dryers. Gas wall heaters are available for cool-weather campers. This is a community-use building, so cleaning is the responsibility of everyone using this building. All units, shelters, and Encampment Field have access to the bathhouse. **Closed in the winter.**

### Chalfant Bathhouse



This bathhouse is located near Chalfant Shelter and is ADA accessible. There are two sides to the bathhouse. One side has a shower and two toilets, while the other side is a single bathroom with a shower and toilet. This is a heated restroom that can be used year-round.

### Large Picnic Shelter

The Large Picnic Shelter is located at the front of the Encampment Field area and close to the camp's pond. This is an open shelter with electric outlets, lighting, a fan, large cooking grills, picnic tables, and benches. There are two large stationary picnic tables with a cooking fire circle and a water faucet nearby. This shelter is an ideal building to use when cooking for large groups, making crafts, and for large event check-in. This area is available for everyone to enjoy; it cannot be reserved unless it is part of an entire campsite rental.



### Stage



The stage is next to the camp pond on the side closest to the camping areas. The stage is covered and has electricity, various lightings options (choose to light up the stage or light up the area around it) and water. This is a great place for talent shows, workshops, and more.

### Trails

Yellow trail (2 miles) – Green trail (1.25 miles) – Orange Trail (1.25 miles). Each trail begins at the same point, at the end of the pond's dam.

### McBride's Pond

McBride's Pond is a 1.5-acre pond stocked with bream and catfish. There is enough room for approximately 50 people when fishing. Catch and release is practiced.

### Beaver Pond

Beaver Pond is approximately 20 acres of flooded field/wood area where beavers, otters, ducks, and other wetland species live. Troops/groups can hike and explore on the 450 feet of floating docks. There is a 16X16 double level observation tower for observing and photographing wetlands wildlife connected to the dock system. The observation tower has some sliding screens for unobstructed views. There are tables, binoculars, educational info available at the tower for use. **Please note** during warm weather, venomous snakes may be seen in and around the wetlands; including next to the dock system.
