

Think Like a Citizen Scientist Journey

Girl Scouts of all levels can explore the scientific method while contributing to research projects conducted by scientists around the world. **Citizen science** is research contributed by communities to enhance the scale or depth of a study. When communities collaborate with scientists, we all learn more about our world and what we can do to make it a better place!
