	Troop Treasurer*	 Help with budgeting, collections, deposits, and payments. Keeps accurate troop records and submits financial reports in a timely manner. Signer on the troop checking account.
	Troop Fall Product Manager*	 Manage and coordinate troop participation in the Fall Product Program. Attends service unit product program training. Trains girls and parents/guardians at a troop meeting. Confirms orders with parents/guardians and enters all data into Fall Product program database.
	Troop Cookie Program Manager*	 Manage and coordinate troop participation in the Girl Scout Cookie Program. Attends service unit cookie program training. Trains girls and parents/guardians at a troop meeting. Confirms orders with parents/guardians and enters all data into Cookie Program database.
	Cookie Booth Chaperone*	 Set up booth table and chaperone shifts of girls during direct sales. Collect money from booth sale and return to troop leader or cookie manager.
	Service Project Coordinator*	Helps troop leaders and girls plan and complete community service projects.
	Outdoor Experience Coordinator*	Helps plan for camp outing(s) or other outdoor experiences with girl and adult input.
	Driver*	 Transport group of girls to field trip locations. Must have valid driver's license and vehicle insurance.
	Shopper*	Shop for troop supplies as needed, including badges.
	Ceremony/Recognition Coordinator	Work with leaders to plan troop ceremonies, such as investiture at start of year, bridging at end of year, and awards at end and/or middle of year.
	Game Expert*	Research and teach girls group games to play.
	Song Expert*	Share your musical gift with girls by researching and teaching them Girl Scout songs or others appropriate for their troop activities.
