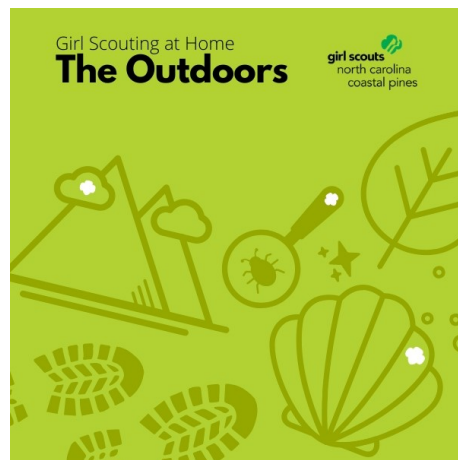

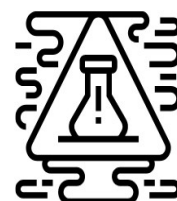

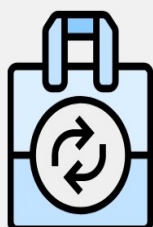

The Outdoors

ANNA BOTSFORD COMSTOCK

- Illustrated thousands of insects for her and her husband's textbooks
- Wrote *The Handbook of Nature Study*, which is still used today
- First female professor at Cornell University



MARJORY STONEMAN DOUGLAS

- Wrote *The Everglades: River of Grass*, which brought great attention to the importance of conserving the Florida Everglades

RACHEL CARSON

- Wrote *Silent Spring* and spoke out against the use of chemical pesticides
- Considered one of the founders of the modern environmentalism movement

JANE GOODALL

- The world's top expert on chimpanzees
- Completed a 55-year(!) field study in Tanzania
- One of the most well-known female conservationists

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WANGARI MAATHAI

- Founded the Green Belt Movement, which teaches Kenyan women how to plant trees and care for the land
- Helped over 30,000 women and planted over 51 million trees
- First African woman to win a Nobel Peace Prize



BERTA ISABEL CÁCERES FLORES

- Co-founded the Council of Popular and Indigenous Organizations of Honduras
- Prevented 4 dams from being illegally built on the Gualcarque River

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ISATOU CEESAY

- Known as the "Queen of Recycling"
- Founded Njau Recycling and Income Generation Group, which turns plastic bags and other materials into purses

GRETA THUNBERG

- Started a school strike for climate movement called Fridays for Future
- Promotes veganism, recycling/upcycling, giving up flying, and other actions to reduce the world's carbon footprint
