energy high. Research shows that mastering a new skill can take up to 400 repetitions—but when learning happens through play, it may take as few as 12. So let's play with purpose!

You'll leave with a collection of ready-to-use games that reinforce fundamentals, encourage teamwork, and keep girls excited about returning to the range. Have a favorite archery game? Bring it along and share your creativity as we build a strong toolbox—together.

Spark to Flame: Fire Building Basics

BB Gun RSO Training *

Learn how to safely handle BB Guns and equipment, while understanding how to manage and teach your Girl Scouts at the same time! This session will prepare adults to facilitate BB Guns for Girl Scouts - North Carolina Coastal Pines and certify you as a national Rifle Association (NRA) Range Safety Office (RSO) for 2 years.

Class Details: There are two portions of this class: Classroom and Practical.

Classroom Section (4-5 hours): You will start in a classroom setting and be trained as a Range Safety Office (RSO) through the National Rifle Association (NRA). This portion is a gun (not BB Gun) related course that teaches how to ensure safety on a gun range where gun owners already know how to use their guns or have taken separate courses on how to use their guns. It has no information about BB Gun specifics, but it is what GSUSA deems appropriate to prepare BB Gun instructors at a Girl Scout Activity.

Practical Section (1-2 hours): This is where you will learn all about BB Guns! You will go to the BB Gun range and get hands-on, practical instructions on how to run the range, load and shoot the BB Guns, and care and maintain the equipment. This section will last as long as needed until participants feel comfortable and ready to lead a range.

The RSO certification itself is a separate fee of \$60 and the participants will pay out-of-pocket directly to the NRA upon completion of the course to obtain their certificate. If the participants choose to renew their credentials, that fee will be \$35 every two years. Current NRA members will be eligible for an additional discount.

Belay Certification Course *

Join us for a day at the tower. During this day-long training, you will learn basic tower safety, how to belay, and be able to climb while having fun!
